EVENT HIGHTLIGHT -- ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, is the beginning of the Lent season, which leads to Easter. Lent reminds us of the wounds, needs and flaws we experience as humans. It honors the death Jesus faced as flawed humans attempted to squash the unlimited love he embodied. This mortality and fragility we face is an invitation to wholeness. We are not tragically wounded with out hope. We return to the literal organic materials of our humanity in relationship with earth, God and others: and to come to terms but the miraculous potential of what we uncover. We chose the anointing of ashes on our bodies to remind us of this potential: God has made us of the dust of the earth and stardust of the universe.
